MINUTES

A. CALL TO ORDER

Hearing Officer Ablao called the hearing to order at 4:13 p.m.

B. CONSENT CALENDAR

1. Approval of the March 12, 2020 regular meeting minutes of the Liquor License Authority.

The Authority has reviewed the minutes and approves them as submitted.

C. ACTION ITEMS

1. **Transfer – Liquor License**

Hearing Officer Ablao stated that this is a public hearing on the application for name change and for a transfer of liquor license. Noted for the record, all documents in the official files held by the secretary will be admitted into the record of this hearing. The Authority swore in Kevin Coates, representative of Sky Noor 2, Inc & 7-Eleven, Inc. Mr. Coates stated that Sky Noor 2 is currently operating under a temporary permit without any issues. Sky Noor 2 also have an operation in Windsor for around three and a half years. There have been no violations or issues associated with alcohol sales. Day to day operations will be by Sky Noor 2 and all employees have been trained in a coming to age program, which has been utilized for the last two to three years. Anyone appearing under the age fifty will be carded. There is nothing in the background of the applicant that makes him uneligible to hold the liquor license. The floorplan is not changing and will continue to operate as it has under the old license. Applicant has experience with holding a liquor license.

The Licensing Authority swore in Mr. Meadows and Mr. Choudhry and asked if they adopt Mr. Coates' statements as if they stated them themselves, both replied yes. Hearing Officer Albalo asked if there are any additions or corrections needing to be made with respect to the testimony, both stated no.

Hearing Officer Ablao asked Mr. Choudhry what the disciplinary action be if one of his employees were to violate the liquor code or regulation? Mr. Choudhry responded every employee goes under training intially when hired then again annually. A liquor violaion like that would result in a write-up and some additional training, and a second offense would result in termination. Hearing Officer Ablao asked if there were plans to do any delivery service, Mr. Choudhry responded no.

Hearing Officer Ablao stated that even though there are some violations for 7-Eleven

stores, they do not reflect on the moral character of the applicant. Hearing Officer Ablao stated that the Town did not receive any comments or questions regarding this application, so the Authority did find based on the evidence and supporting documentation that the statutory requirements for this Transfer have been met, and the application is approved upon satisfactory inspection of the premises by the town and continued compliance with the liquor code and regulations.
